Kerry Lynn S. Nankivell joined the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies in July 2008. She is a maritime security specialist with broad expertise in the Asian littoral. She has published on an array of regional maritime issues, from the South China Sea disputes and regional naval modernization programs, to sea lane security, piracy and other non-traditional challenges in the maritime domain. She takes a leading role in DKI APCSS' maritime-focused programming, conducting workshops in Honolulu and around the Asian littoral from Vladivostok to Mumbai. Ms. Nankivell also undertakes teaching and research related to strategy and decision-making, and complexity in world politics. She is currently the Chair of the College Curriculum Committee, overseeing faculty input to College executives on all DKI APCSS curricula.

Ms. Nankivell came to the DKI APCSS from the Canadian Forces' Pacific Headquarters in Victoria, B.C., where she served on staff of Canada's Commander, Maritime Forces Pacific. In her capacity as a Program Manager in the Office of the Asia-Pacific Policy Advisor, Ms. Nankivell oversaw ongoing analysis of the Asia-Pacific region prepared for the senior naval staff, and coordinated policy consultation with academic experts outside the Command.

Ms. Nankivell earned a B.A. (Honors) in Political Science with International Relations from the University of British Columbia (2000) and a MPhil in International Relations from Cambridge University (2002). Her writing has appeared in industry journals and magazines, including *Asian Security*, *Asia Pacific Defense Forum*, *Ocean Development and International Law*, *Cambridge Review of International Affairs*, *Journal of the Australian Naval Institute*, *Canadian Naval Review*, *Asia-Pacific Defence Reporter*, *Maritime Warfare Bulletin*, and *Foreign Policy*. She has contributed to four major publications, *From APEC 2011 to APEC 2012* (2012), *Issues for Engagement* (2009), *Understanding Global Terror* (2007), and *Why Japan Matters* (2005). Finally, she served as editor for the *Cambridge Review of International Affairs* (2002-2003). Ms. Nankivell is fluent in French.
