



## Course Description

May 8-13, 2016

Transnational Security Cooperation (TSC) is an intensive executive education program for current leaders of significant national, regional, or international responsibility. It is the most senior-level course offered by the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies (DKI APCSS) designed for two-star/civilian equivalents and above. The course provides senior security practitioners from the Asia-Pacific region an opportunity to:

- Enhance their understanding of transnational security issues and the complex environment in which they occur;
- Explore and practice collaborative leadership strategies, including assessment and planning, to address transnational security issues;
- Identify opportunities for enhancing effective and accountable security sector governance at the national, regional, and international levels.

DKI APCSS is a Department of Defense security studies institution. Its course offerings go beyond a discussion of military affairs to address issues related to state and regional security. Courses are designed to advance a comprehensive understanding of both traditional and non-traditional security issues. The TSC course provides interactive sessions on a wide-ranging set of salient transnational security concerns including terrorism, environmental degradation, natural disasters, geopolitical competition, maritime disputes, cyber threats, civil-military dynamics, and regional governance.

The course is launched on Sunday (May 8) with an informal Welcome Reception. Academic discussions begin on Monday (May 9), setting the scene with expert, participant, and breakout group assessments of existential transnational security threats and skill-building sessions on strategic assessment, planning, and leadership. Tuesday (May 10) features plenary and elective settings, in which key transnational issues impacting the global commons and regional geopolitics will be addressed. Plenary sessions on Wednesday (May 11) focus on demographics, social media and terrorism, and humanitarian assistance and disaster response (HADR) to inform strategic role-playing exercises. Electives on regional issues are also offered on this day. Thursday's discussions (May 12) cover the 3 Ds - Defense, Development, and Diplomacy - of national security at DKI APCSS and the U.S. Pacific Command. On Friday (May 13), the course concludes, highlighting effective security sector governance and opportunities for regional cooperation.
