The Daniel K. Inouye Institute (DKII) was established in 2013 to tell the story of Senator Daniel K. Inouye and to continue his legacy of civic engagement and leadership by supporting education, public service and international cultural exchanges. To support that vision, the DKII established a fellowship program for interns volunteering in the Regional Security Studies Intern Program (RSSIP) at the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies (the Center). The Center is a U.S. Department of Defense executive education institute that addresses regional and global security issues, inviting military and civilian representatives of the United States and Asia-Pacific nations to its comprehensive program of executive education courses and workshops, both in Hawaii and throughout the Asia-Pacific region. In 2015, DKII established an endowment to support some of the Center's volunteer interns, administered by the Pacific International Center for High Technology Research (PICHTR), and distributed in the form of cash awards. Through the cooperation of DKII and PICHTR, interns at the Center have the chance to receive an Inouye Fellowship.

The Inouye Fellowship: Inouye Fellowships are modest cash awards of \$1,000 and are competitive based on need and merit. Applicants must be accepted for participation in the RSSIP. This fellowship is available to Hawaii residents, or recent Hawaii residents, enrolled in or admitted to, or recently graduated from an undergraduate or graduate academic program related to public service or international relations, in an accredited college or university in Hawaii or beyond.

How to Apply: Inouye Fellowship applications are available in three cycles for the spring, summer and fall. The window to submit Spring applications is between December 15 and January 15. The window to submit Summer applications is between March 15 and April 15. The window to submit Fall applications is between August 15 and September 15. Eligible applicants must send the attached application form, a copy of their resume and a copy of their most current FAFSA SAR form (for those current students receiving financial aid) electronically to Ms. Lori Leong at lori.leong@pichtr.org or in hard copy to PICHTR at the address below.
