The Center seeks world-class educators to teach, facilitate, research, and build capacity of security professionals in the Indo-Pacific Region.

Responsibilities for associate/full professor faculty members

- Teaching executive education courses in a participant-centered, activity-based context
- Facilitating seminars, workshops, dialogues and visits
- Contributing to capacity building endeavors and security cooperation projects in the region
- Analyzing security-related trends in the Indo-Pacific region
- Contributing to curriculum development
- Performing administrative and staff duties to support the Center's academic functions

Desirable selection criteria for associate/full professor faculty members

- Knowledge of defense institution building including, civil-military, interagency and cross-sector coordination, strategic planning and information sharing
- Expertise in crisis and disaster management in one or more Indo-Pacific countries
- Familiarity with facilitation-based teaching and state-of-the-art educational technology
- Experience in development, capacity building, and national security consultations as related to the evolution and transformation of roles and responsibilities of security agencies
- Experience working with U.S. embassies in region, including familiarity with a country team, office of defense cooperation, U.S. State Department and USAID policies
- Experience with exercises and wargames
- Demonstrable skill in at least one regional language

Essential selection criteria for **HADR** associate/full professor faculty members

• High level of experience in crisis and disaster management

- Understanding of HADR at operational and strategic levels
- Knowledge of the disaster management phases including risk reduction and resilience
- Awareness of national, regional and international crisis response management frameworks, strategies and mechanisms
- Professional expertise at the operational, strategic or policy level in a multilateral setting

Essential selection criteria for **SSR/SSD** associate/full professor faculty members

- High level of experience in security and defense sector governance, development, and institutional capacity building of Indo-Pacific partner governments to increase capacity within their security institutions
- Experience in national security consultations, sector-wide coordination, and/or strategic planning as related to the evolution and transformation of roles and responsibilities of security agencies
- Demonstrable familiarity with U.S. Government legislation, policies, processes, and officials

Qualifications and attributes for associate/full professor faculty members

- Master's or doctoral degree
- Proven ability in teaching and seminar facilitation
- Proven ability to function as a team member

Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications. Salary range is \$90,789 - \$120,157 excludes locality pay (18.43%) and cost of living allowance (COLA), currently 10.99% but subject to change. All faculty at the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies are employed on limited-term, excepted-service positions, for up to three years, with the possibility of renewal. Relocation expenses may be authorized.

- Applications will be considered against current Faculty requirements
- Application packages will be retained for one year
- Application materials become the property of the U.S. Department of the Defense and will not be returned
- Individuals selected for interviews will be asked to provide bona fide transcripts from the academic institutions granting their advanced degree(s) and two samples of their publications
