Responsibilities for associate/full professor faculty members

- Lecturing on selected regional security topics in executive education courses
- Facilitating seminars, workshops, dialogues, and visits
- Managing and coordinating courses
- Ability to develop curriculum, teach, facilitate small groups, team, and perform administrative staff duties in support of the Center's academic functions

Essential selection criteria for **Crisis Management** associate/full professor faculty members

- Expertise in crisis management at the strategic policy and/or operational level in one or more Indo-Pacific countries
- Experience managing, researching or working in disaster response, conflict situations, humanitarian assistance or organizational crises
- Analyzing crisis management trends and developing regional expertise
- Awareness of local, national, regional and international crisis and disaster response frameworks, strategies and mechanisms

Essential selection criteria for **South Asia** associate/full professor faculty members

- Regional expertise in South Asia that includes in-depth knowledge of regional security dynamics.
- Expertise in security, defense, and/or political-economic issues in one or more South Asian countries
- Living or working experience in one or more South Asian countries
- Ability to converse in a South Asian language other than English

Essential selection criteria for **Oceania** associate/full professor faculty members

- Regional expertise in Oceania that includes in-depth knowledge of regional security dynamics.
- Expertise in security, defense, and/or political-economic issues in several Oceania countries
- Living or working experience in one or more Oceania country
- Ability to converse in a Oceania language other than English

Required qualifications and attributes for associate/full professor faculty members

- Doctoral or Master's degree
- U.S. citizen, or foreign national who has resided in the U.S. for three of the last five years
- Proven ability in teaching and seminar facilitation
- Proven ability to function as a team member

Desirable selection criteria for associate/full professor faculty members

- Ability to teach a gendered security perspective
- Experience at the operational, strategic, or policy level in a multilateral setting
- Awareness of security issues in one or more countries in the Indo-Pacific region

Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications. Salary range is \$91,528 - \$138,810 exclusive of locality pay (18.43%) and cost of living allowance (10.99%). All faculty at the Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies are employed on limited-term, excepted-service positions, for up to three years, with the possibility of renewal. Relocation expenses may be authorized.

- Applications will be considered against current Faculty requirements
- Application packages will be retained for one year
- Application materials become the property of the U.S. Department of the Defense and will not be returned
- Individuals selected for interviews will be asked to provide bona fide transcripts from the academic institutions granting their advanced degree(s) and two samples of their publications
